You Will Need

Sport/Fine Weight Yarn in small amounts (Drops Baby Merino 50 gram / 125 metres): A - Old Pink (Gammelrosa 27), B - White (Vit 01), (Scheepjes Maxi Sweet Treat 25 gram / 140 metres) C - Black (110) and D - Powder Pink (238); B-1/ C-2 / 2,5 mm hook (4/0); Yarn needle; Scissor; Stitch marker; Small amount of toy stuffing

Skill level: Intermediate

Terminology

st - stitch tch - turning chain stitch* rnd - round

rep - repeat

FP - Front Post

FO - Front Loop

BL - Back Loop

tog - together

sl st - slip stitch

ch - chain stitch

sc - single crochet

dc - double crochet

tr - treble crochet

Turning chain stitch*

A normal chain stitch; that does not count as a stitch in the pattern

Note!

This bunny is worked as one piece. No other sewing but fastening off the ends and embroidering small details.

The Pattern

Please note! This pattern is mainly worked in a spiral. Use a stitch marker to easily find your beginning stitch each round. Also, make your slip knot about 15 cm in on your starting thread for sewing together any gaps that might occur after the initial rounds.

Rnd 1: In color A: ch 7 + tch, turn (7 ch)

Rnd 2: Begin in the second loop from your hook (i.e. the 7th ch made in the previous rnd): 1 hdc in the next st, hdc in the next 6 sts, 4 hdc in the next st (i.e. the 1st ch made in the previous rnd) which will make you turn around to the opposite side of the chains, hdc in the next 6 sts, 3 hdc in the next st (i.e. in the same ch as the first hdc made in this rnd) (20 hdc)

Rnd 3: sc in the next 7 sts, 3 sc in the next st x rep 2 times (26 sc)

Rnd 4-5: sc in the next 26 sts (26 sc x 2 rnds)

Now we are going to make room for the bottom of the little tail...

Rnd 6: sc in the next 3 sts, BLsc in in the next 3 sts, sc in the next 20 sts (26 sc)

Rnd 7-8: sc in the next 26 sts (26 sc x 2 rnds)

Tail time! It's time to crochet the cute little tail and by doing so: a short color change. Simply put: it's a usual scrnd with the exception of the making of the tail that consists of a combination of tr:s that are worked together over the three unworked front loops left in rnd 6.

Rnd 9: sc in the next 6 sts, change to color B and work tr5tog like following: 2 tr in the first FO + 1 tr in the second FO + 2 tr in the third FO. Before making the last yarn over and pull through: switch back to color A and finish the tr5tog.

Cut off color B, pull the two ends inside the body with your hook or a yarn needle and tie together with a double knot.

They will be well hidden inside and worked over so they won't be noticeable at all.

sc in the next 20 sts (26 sc + 1 tr5tog in FO)

Rnd 10: sc in the next 8 sts, FPsc around the tr5tog, sc in the next 18 sts (26 sc + 1 FPsc)

Rnd 11: sc in the next 8 sts, sc2tog over the next 2 sts, sc in the next 17 sts (25 sc + 1 sc2tog)

Rnd 12: sc in next 26 sts (26 sc)

Stuff with a small amount of toy stuffing. You want it to be flat yet cozy, but not overstuffed!

Rnd 13: sl st + ch 1 in the next st.

Now: press both long sides together and crochet through both sides to close your bunny like following: sc in the next 12 sts, sl st in the next st + tch, turn (12 sc, 2 sl sts, 1 ch1)

Do not cut the thread!

The left ear

Note! The ears are both made in rows

Row 1: sc in the next 5 sts + tch, turn (5 sc)

Row 2: sc in the next 5 sts + tch, turn (5 sc)

Row 3: sc in the next st, (sc2tog over the next 2 sts) x 2 times +

tch, turn (1 sc, 2 sc2tog)

Row 4-18: sc in the next 3 sts + tch, turn (3 sc x 15 rows)

Row 19: sc in the next st, sc2tog over the next 2 sts + tch, turn (1

sc, 1 sc2tog)

Row 20: sc in the next 2 sts + tch, turn (2 sc)

Row 21: sc2tog over the next 2 sts + tch, turn (1 sc2tog)

Row 22: sc in the next st + tch, turn (1 sc)

Row 23: sl st down along the inner side of the ear and end with a sl

st in the same place as the fifth sc made in row 1

(approximatly 21 sl st)

By doing this the ears will connect securly to the body and be sturdier.

The right ear

The right ear is mirroring the left ear

Row 1: sl st in the next 3 sts, sc in the next 5 sts + tch, turn

(3 sl st, 5 sc)

Row 2: sc in the next 5 sts + tch, turn (5 sc)

Row 3: (sc2tog over the next 2 sts) x 2 times, sc in the next st +

tch, turn (2 sc2tog, 1 sc)

Row 4-18: sc in the next 3 sts + tch, turn (3 sc x 15 rows)

Row 19: sc2tog over the next 2 sts, sc in the next st + tch, turn

(1 sc2tog, 1 sc)

Row 20: sc in the next 2 sts + tch, turn (2 sc)

Row 21: sc2tog over the next 2 sts + tch, turn (1 sc2tog)

Row 22: sc in the next st + tch, turn (1 sc)

Row 23: sl st down along the inner side of the ear and end with a sl

st in the same place as the first sc made in row 1

(approximatly 21 sl st)

By doing this the ears will connect securly to the body and be sturdier.

Cut the thread and fasten off!

The Finishing Touches

Tie both ears with a double knot and pull gently upwards to "free the space and create the small gap.



The embroidery takes a bit of practice but it gives you a lot of personality to your bunny in return.

Tip! Make sure to insert your needle through your stitches and not in the hole/gap between two.

1

The nose is embroidered as a small cross stitch made over the 7th stitch of round 7.

2

The eyes is worked over 3 stitches lined diagonally with the nose.

3

The tummy details are best done randomly and impulsively in the shapes of lines and small v:s.
