The Story Behind...

The tiny and oh so lovely flower Mysotósis palústris (Forget-me-nots) has kind of large petals that most commonly shifts in light blue or white. You can usually find them beside a dirt road or along the beach, and they blossom all summer.

This was my inspiration while making this decorative little flower that you can use in so many different ways. You can tie it around a vase, your wrist or why not around your beach bag?! Tie it around a flowerpot or maybe around your curtains? Or simply skip the ribbon and attach it to a hairpiece.

By adjusting the length of your ribbon; you can add more flowers and make a beuatiful boho-bunting...

Please feel free to be creative and play around with it.

You Will Need

Fine Weight Yarn in small amounts (Scheepjes Maxi Sweet Treat 25 gram / 140 metres): A - Linen (505), B - Blue Bell (173), C - Amethyst (240); B-1 / 2,25 mm hook; Yarn needle; Scissor

Note! This is a scrap yarn project that requires very little yarn and you can use about any weight or sort.

Skill level: Adventureus Beginner

Abbrevations

<u>US-terminology</u>

st - stitch

sl st - slip stitch

ch - chain stitch

ch sp - chain space

sc - single crochet

hdc - half double crochet

dc - double crochet



Note!

You can always take help by the Pictorial on page 5 for parts you find tricky!

The Pattern

- Rnd 1 (A): 6 hdc in magic circle, close with a sl st into the first st (6 hdc)
- Rnd 2: Begin with a standing st: (2 dc + ch1) in the next st; rep tilend, close with an invisible join to the 2nd st (12 dc, 6 ch1-sps)
- Rnd 3 (B): Begin in any given: *(sc + ch4 + sc) around the next ch1-sp, skip the next st, sc around the space between the 2 dcs, skip the next st; rep from * til end, close with a sl st into the first st (18sc, 6 ch4-sps)
- Rnd 4: Begin with a standing st: sl st into the next ch4-sp: *(8 dc + ch1) around the next ch4-sp, skip the next st, hdc + ch1 in the space between the sts; rep from * til end, close with an invisible join to the 2nd st (48 dc, 12 ch1-sps, 6 hdc)

Finishing touches:

To make the ribbon; simply chain stitch (Color C) until preferred lenght and tie a little knot on each end of it. Sew flower onto the center and hide ends.


