But back to the story. Just as the LoopELoops themselves, this background story is pretty short. I always get a bit nuts about bunnies this time of year and with Easter quickly approaching and the Tiny Tie Knots pattern re-written and launched just about the very last week; I was sitting in my armchair yarn doodling when this idea of a simple two rounds kind fo bunny ornament popped by and said hi.

It's definitely a perfect scrap yarn project; I dare to say that anything yarn way goes. I have made them in thin yarn, thicker yarn, jumbo yarn... They are all turning out absolutely adorable! So grab those hooks and yarn from your stash and lets get hooking..

You Will Need

Sport/Fine Weight Yarn in small amounts (Yarn And Colors Must-have 50 gram / 125 metres): A - Cotton Candy (037); C-2 / 3 mm hook (5/0); Tiny bit of string for the hanging; Yarn needle;

Scissor

Note! This is a scrap yarn project that requires very little yarn and you can use about any weight or sort.

Skill level: Adventureus Beginner

Abbreviations

US-terminology

st - stitch

sl st - slip stitch

ch - chain stitch

ch sp - chain space

sc - single crochet

p - picot*



Picot*

Chain 2 and slip stitch through the brackets of the previous stitch

Note!

The Pattern

- Step 1:** ch 6 and sl st into the first ch made to form a ring (1 ch6-sp, 1 sl st)
- Step 2:** (ch 5 + sl st back down into the first ch made from rnd 1) x 2 times (2 ch5-sps + 2 sl sts)
- Step 3:** whilst working over your yarn end: work 10 sc into the ch6-sp (10 sc)
- Step 4:** work (3 sc + p + 3 sc) into the first ch5-sp, sl st tightly between the ears back down into the ch6-sp. Work (3 sc + p + 3 sc) into the second ch5-sp, sl st into the first sc of step 3, fasten off and weave in your ends (12 sc, 2 p, 2 sl st)
- Step 5:** cut a small piece of string and attach through the left ear to create a hanging loop

Well done!

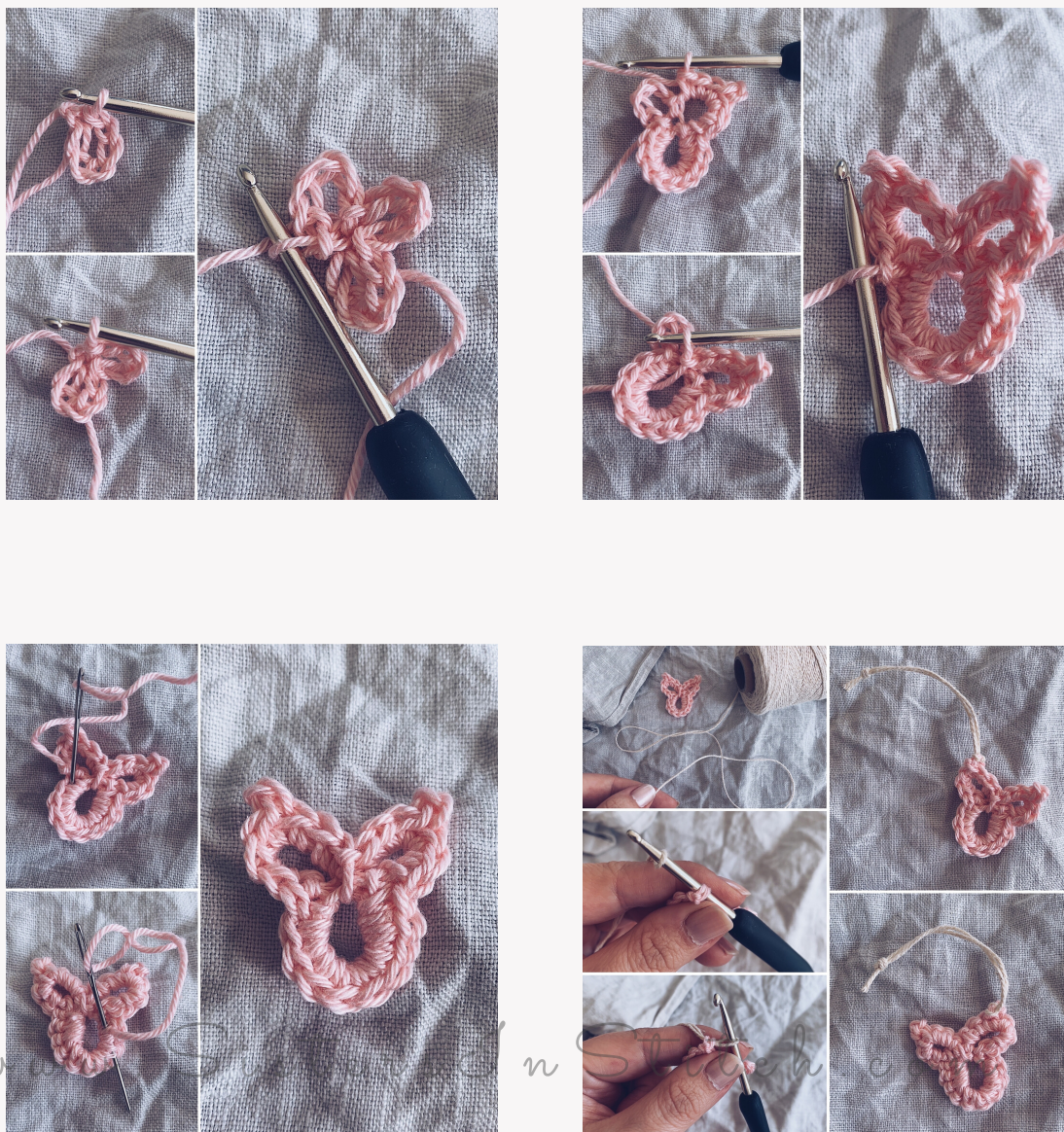
