You Will Need

7 colors of
Muskat by Drops:

A: Light ice blue (60)

B: White (18)

C: Old fashion pink (29)

D: Light yellow (07)

E: Light mint (20)

You can use any type of yarn for this square. However, we suggest a cotton for the best structure and stitch definition.

We also used a 4 mm hook, stitch marker, a darning needle and scissors.

Skill level: Adventures Beginner

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Abbreviations

US-terminology

st - stitch

rnd - round

fo - Fasten Off

(end your rnds with an invisible join to the 2nd st)

sc inc - single crochet increase

(2 stitches worked in 1)

tch - turning chain

(does not count as a st in the pattern)

ch - chain stitch

ch sp - chain space

sl st - slip stitch

sc - single crochet

hdc - half double crochet

dc - double crochet

p - picot

(ch 2 + sl st through the brackets of the previous st)

*Note! The finished Wallicorn
measures approximately 15 cm x 15 cm*

The Pattern

The Main Body (A + B)

To begin:

ch 45 + tch, turn.

- 45 ch

rnd 1 (A) Begin in the second loop from the hook:

1 sc in each st across + tch, turn.

- 45 sc

rnd 2-4 (A)

1 sc in the next 45 sts + tch, *cut of the yarn whilst saving a long thread for sewing (about 30-40 cm).*

- 45 sc (*45 sc x 3 rows in total*)

Your strip will measure approximately 25 cm x 2,5 cm whilst laying flat.

rnd 5 (B) *With the Right Side facing you and the long sides placed against each other; crochet them together stitch against stitch:*

1 sc in the next 45 sts + tch, *cut of the yarn whilst saving a long thread for sewing (about 15-20 cm).*

- 45 sc (*worked through both pieces*)

Your strip will measure approximately 25 cm x 2 cm whilst laying flat.

The ring assembly

Step 1. Color A

Begin with using the long thread left from row 4; stitch together the short sides as neatly as possible with the mattress stitch.

Step 2. Color B

Make an invisible join to the second st and sew the color B sides together in the same way as for color A. This joining part will be covered by the leaves and flowers later on so don't worry if it doesn't look perfect.

The horn (D)

The horn is crocheted top down and in the rounds, use a stitch marker to keep track of the beginning. It may feel a bit tight and tricky at first so take it slow and steady. If you think there is too much gap you could choose to go down a hook size!

rnd 1

4 sc in a magic circle.

- 4 sc

rnd 2

(2 sc in the next st, 1 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 6 sc

rnd 3-4

1 sc in each st across.

- 6 sc (6 sc for 2 rows)

Fasten the beginning thread inside the horn.

rnd 5

(1 sc in the next 2 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 8 sc

rnd 6

(1 sc in the next 3 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 10 sc

rnd 7

1 sc in each st across.

- 10 sc

rnd 8

(1 sc in the next 4 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 12 sc

rnd 9

1 sc in each st across.

- 12 sc

rnd 10

1 sc in the next 3 sts, 2 sc in the next st, 1 sc in the next 5 sts, 2 sc in the next st, 1 sc in the next 2 sts.

- 14 sc

rnd 11

1 sc in each st across.

- 14 sc

Sl st in the first st, save a long thread (approximately 90 cm) and then cut the yarn.

The embroidery and assembly of the horn

Sew up the bottom stitch by stitch, ending on one side. Continue using the same thread but now working in a spiral, up the horn; through the stitches to the top (see the video tutorial). Place the needle through the top and down out through the bottom of the horn again.

Don't pull!

Attach the horn on top of the ring, centring over the joining place, with overhand stitches all the way around both front and back, and then fasten off.

The Ears (A) Make 2 pieces

rnd 1

4 sc in a magic circle.

- 4 sc

rnd 2

(2 sc in the next st, 1 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 6 sc

rnd 3

(1 sc in the next st, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 8 sc

Fasten off the beginning thread

rnd 4

1 sc in each st across.

- 8 sc

rnd 5

(1 sc in the next 3 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 10 sc

rnd 6

(1 sc in the next 4 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 12 sc

rnd 7

(1 sc in the next 5 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 14 sc

rnd 8-10

1 sc in each st across.

- 14 sc (14 sc for 3 rnds in total)

rnd 8-9-10

(1 sc in the next 4 sts, 2 sc in the next st) x 2 times.

- 12 sc

rnd 9

1 sc in each st across.

- 12 sc

rnd 10

1 sc in the next 3 sts, 2 sc in the next st, 1 sc in the next 5 sts, 2 sc in the next st, 1 sc in the next 2 sts.

- 14 sc

rnd 11

1 sc in each st across.

- 14 sc

Sl st in the first st, save a long thread (approximately 30-40 cm) and then cut the yarn.

Attach the ears on top of the ring on each side of the horn with overhand stitches all the way around both front and back, and then fasten off.

Embroidery of the inner ears (C)

***Note!** The video tutorial is very helpful for this part.*

Turn your piece so you have the front side facing you. Find the middle and go from inside the ear and out.

1. Insert the needle through any in the bottom, sew approximately 4 rows up and end at the beginning stitch at bottom.
2. Do the same but diagonally and only 3 rows up on the left, coming back down and out through the same first stitch.
3. Repeat for the right side.4-5. Place the needle under all three lines to pull them together, place the thread over on the front; omitting all of them and go back down the same stitch as usual.

Tie a double knot on the inside and hide in the ear.

Assembly of the ears (C)

1. Fold the sides of the ear against each other slightly and use the blue thread to make them crease by placing a stitch through it and back.
2. Place it one or two stitches from the right side of the horn. Continue on working with the blue thread and attach the ear onto the ring with overhand stitches.

Attach the second ear on the left side of the horn in the same way.

The leafs (E) Make 4 pieces

Ch 5; sl st in the second st from the hook, 1 sc + 1 hdc in the next st, 2 hdc in the next st, 1 hdc + 1 sc in the next st.

Now turn your piece and work around the opposite side. Begin in the same stitch you are already in:

1 sc + 1 hdc in the next st, 2 hdc in the next st, 2 hdc + p2b in the next st, close gently with an invisible join to the second st.

Save a long thread (approximately 40 cm and then cut the yarn for attaching the leaf to the main piece..

Use the beginning end to sew in any gaps created with the chain stitches. Use the final end and attach to the main body.

The Roses (D + C) Make 2 pieces

Large sized rose (5 petals)

Row 1

ch 10

- 10 ch

Row 2 *Begin in the second eyelet from the hook;*

4 hdc + 1 sl st in the next st, 1 sl st in the next st, (1 hdc + 3 dc + 1 hdc + 1 sl st in the next st, 1 sl st in the next st) x 3 times, 1 hdc + 3 dc + 1 hdc + 1 sl st in the next st.

- 12 hdc, 12 dc, 9 sl st

Leave a long tail, curl the piece into a rose (see the video tutorial) and sew a few stitches through the bottom to secure the shape. Use the long threads to attach the leafs and flowers onto the first layer of the ring, i.e. don't work through the entire piece!

Small sized rose (4 petals)

Row 1

ch 10

- 10 ch

Row 2 *Begin in the second eyelet from the hook:*

(4 hdc + 1 sl st in the next st, 1 sl st in the next st) x 3 times, 4 hdc + 1 sl st in the next st.

- 16 hdc, 8 sl st

Leave a long tail, curl the piece into a rose (see pic) and sew a few stitches through the bottom to secure the shape. Use the long threads to attach the leafs and flowers onto the first layer of the ring, i.e. don't work through the entire piece!

The hanging (A)

This is the easiest of easy; simply cut a long thread, stitch it through some stitches the backside, then tie both ends into a double knot close to the main body. Then tie the top strands together and finally trim the ends. Done!
