Sisters In Stitch



The Thistle Twist Flower

Designed by Therese Eghult

You Will Need

Tools:

A 3 mm hook

A pair of scissors and a darning needle

Yarn:

Small amounts of 2 colors of yarn.

We have used Must-have by Yarn and colors in the shades:

A: Vanilla (010)

B: Ice Blue (063)

You can use practically any type of yarn that you want for this flower.

However, we suggest a cotton for the best structure and stitch

definition.



Abbreviations

US-terminology

st - stitch

rnd - round

fo - Fasten Off

End your rounds with an invisible join to the 2nd stitch

ch - chain stitch

ch sp - chain space

st ch - starting chain stitch

sl st - slip stitch

sc - single crochet

dc -double crochet

tr - treble crochet

Please note that the starting and closing chains does not count as stitches in this pattern if not stated otherwise.

The Pattern

The flower

Rnd 1. (Ice blue)

In a magic circle make: st ch 1, 6 sc, 1 sl st in the first st to close

- 6 sc

Rnd 2.

st ch1, *2 sc in the next 6 sts; rep from * til end, 1 sl st in the first st to close

- 12 sc

Rnd 3-6.

st ch 1, 1 sc in the next 12 sts, 1 sl st in the first st to close
- 12 sc per rnd, 4 rnds in total

Rnd 7. Turn your work and have the wrong side facing you *1 sl st + ch 5 + 1 tr + ch 1 + 1 tr + ch 1 + 1 tr + ch 5 + 1 sl st in the next st; rep from * til end, fo

- 24 sl st, 24 ch5-sp, 36 tr, 12 ch1-sp

The flower pistils

Rnd 8. (Vanilla) Independent round. In a magic circle make: st ch 1, 5 sc, sl st in the first st to close
- 5 sc

Note! The closing sl st of rnd 8 counts as the first of rnd 9.

Rnd 9.

*1 sl st + ch 5 + (3 hdc in the second loop from the hook + 1 sl st in the next three loops) + 1 sl st back into the same next st; rep from * til end, fo whilst leaving a 10 cm ending tail

- 25 sl st, 5 ch5-sp, 15 hdc

Now fasten off your starting thread. Then take your long end tail and sew through the center of the flower, placing the piece in the bottom of your flower body, and attach with a few stitches to the back.
