The Story Behind

This little floral inspired bookmark came to be as the mean to keep track of all the patterns that I was working on in the “The Ultimate Granny Square Sourcebook”. With over a 100 to keep track of; let’s just say that I needed several..

This bookmark is a super quick make and requires less than 2 gram of yarn so now you can turn those amazing scraps; that you haven’t had the heart to get rid of, into darling bookmarks for you and yours.

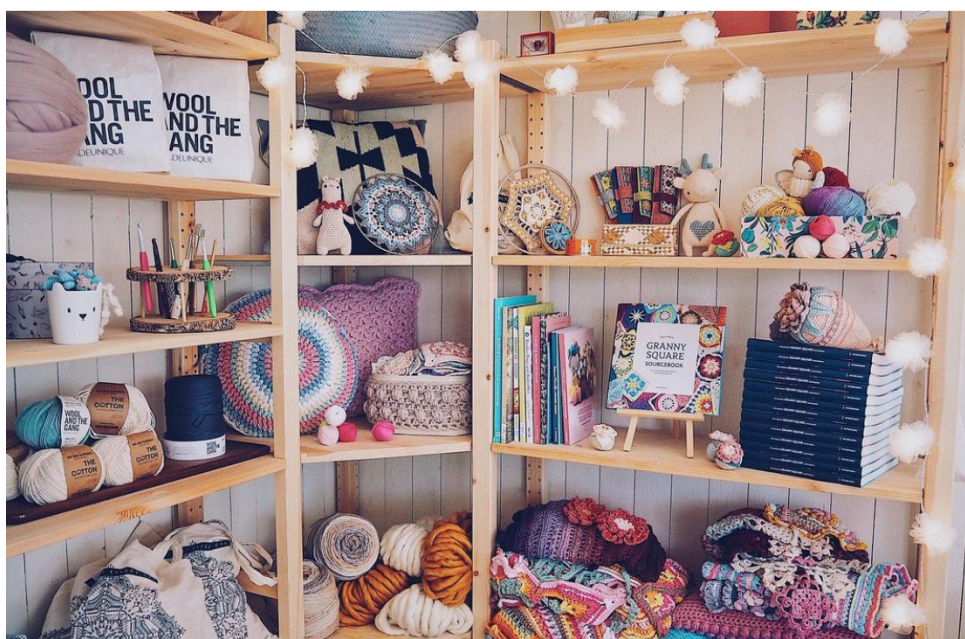
Oh and a fun fact: I actually make a bookmark for each of the signed books that is bought from our shop; using the scrap yarns from the skeins used for the squares that is seen in the book!

To shop small is the best.

You Will Need

We have used a 3 mm hook,
a darning needle and
scissors.

1 color of Must-have by
Yarn and colors:

Mustard (015) 2 gram per bookmark



Note! You can use any type of yarn but we recommend
a cotton for the best stitch definition.



Abbreviations

US-terminology

st - stitch

ch - chain stitch

sl st - slip stitch

sc - single crochet

hdc - half double crochet

dc -double crochet

p2b - picot 2 b

chain 2 and then slip stitch through the front legs
of the previous stitch made

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The Pattern

The first leaf

Step 1. Ch 4 + 1 sl st back into the first ch made to create a circle.

- 1 ch4-sp + 1 sl st

Step 2. Work around the circle

Make 1 sc to the **right side** of the slip knot, make 2 sc on the **left side** of the same slip knot. *The video tutorial is really helpful here.*

Continue and make 2 hdc + 3 dc + p2b + 3 dc + 2 hdc + 1 sc around the circle. Make 1 sl st into the first sc to close the leaf.

- 4 sc, 4 hdc, 6 dc, 1 p2b, 1 sl st

Place a stitch marker in the second sc made of the leaf.

The second leaf

Step 1. Ch 4 + 1 sl st back into the first ch made to create a circle.

- 1 ch4-sp + 1 sl st

Step 2. Work around the circle

Make 1 sc to the **right side** of the joining space of the first leaf, make 2 sc on the **left side** of the joining space. *The video tutorial is really helpful here.*

Continue and make 2 hdc + 3 dc + p2b + 3 dc + 2 hdc + 1 sc around the circle. Make 1 sl st into the first sc to close the leaf.

- 4 sc, 4 hdc, 6 dc, 1 p2b, 1 sl st

The third leaf

Repeat the 1st and 2nd step of the second leaf.

Joining the leaves - *The video tutorial is really helpful here*

To get a flat and neat join we are making slip stitches through the leaves in two places.

Step 1. Hold the three leaves so that the p2b of the second one is pointing towards you; placing the first one to the left and the third one to the right.

Step 2. In the space between second sc of the first leaf (in which you have a stitch marker placed in) and last single crochet (that holds the closing sl st): make a sl st. Tighten.

Step 3. Make a sl st in the back loops of the last sc of third leaf **and** the second sc of the first leaf.

The bookmark ribbon

Ch 55 (or as many as you need for the length of your book)

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The forth leaf

Step 1. Ch 4 + 1 sl st back into the first ch made to create a circle.

- 1 ch4-sp + 1 sl st

Step 2. Work around the circle

Make 1 sc to the right side of the joining space of the first leaf, make 2 sc on the left side of the joining space. *The video tutorial is really helpful here.*

Continue and make 2 hdc + 3 dc + p2b + 3 dc + 2 hdc + 1 sc around the circle. Close with an invisible join to the second sc of the leaf and fasten off your ends.

- 4 sc, 4 hdc, 6 dc, 1 p2b, 1 sl st
