Sisters In Stitch



The Petite Pouch

You Will Need

We have used Must-have by Yarn And Colors: A: Icy Blue B:Birch C: Pearl D: Ecru You can use any type of yarn for this make but please note that it can affect the finished size.

We also used a 3 mm hook, a small button, a darning needle and scissors.

Skill level: Intermediate

Nation

- Work in continuous rounds unless the pattern does not state otherwise, mark the first st of each round with a stitch marker.
- Tip. Keep a long starting tail (10 cm or such) so that you may use it to sew shut any gaps that may occur whilst working in the starting ch 8 in round 2.
- Bobble note! For round 2, 4 and 6: Push the bobbles to the front with your finger before finishing the following sc and then keep those sc tight to lock the bobble in place.
- Keep working in your ends as you switch colors! It's tricky to do it once it's finished.

Abbreviations

US-terminology

st - stitch rnd - round fo - Fasten Off

end your rnds with an invisible join to the 2nd st

sl st - slip stitch ch - chain stitch ch sp - chain space sc - single crochet

bob - bobble

(3 dc worked together into the same stitch)
 tch - turning chain
(does not count as a stitch in the pattern)

RS - Right Side off your work facing you WS - Wrong Side off your work facing you



To begin (color A): ch 10, 1 tch + turn (10 ch).

Round 1: 2 sc in 2nd st from hook, 1 sc in the next 8 sts, 3 sc in the next st (which makes you turn to the other side of the chains), 1 sc in the next 8 sts, 1 sc in the same space as the first 2 sc of the round (22 sc).

Round 2: *1 sc in the next st, 1 bobble in the next st; rep from * til end (11 sc, 11 bobbles).

Round 3: 1 sc in the next 22 sts, fo (22 sc).

Round 4 (color B), begin in the second sc of rnd 3: *1 sc in the next st, 1 bobble in the next st; rep from * til end, fo (11 sc, 11 bobbles).

Round 5 (color C), begin in the last sc of rnd 4: 1 sc in the next 22 sts (22 sc).

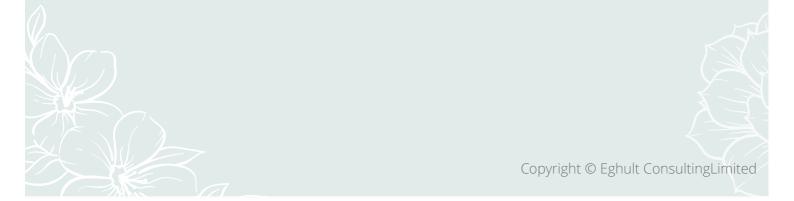
Round 6: *1 sc in the next st, 1 bobble in the next st; rep from * til end (11 sc, 11 bobbles).

Round 7: 1 sc in the next 22 sts, fo (22 sc).

Round 8-10 (color D), begin in the 15th sc from rnd 7: 1 sc in the next 22 sts (22 sc for 3 rounds in total).

You should now be able to press the two long sides (the back and front) of your pouch together flat and have your last st of rnd 10 be placed at the left corner of it. If not, keep making sc til your reach it as we are about to begin the lid section.

Remember to mark the first sts of rnd 11.





The Lid

Round 11 (RS): 1 sc in the next 12 sts, tch + turn (12 sc).

Round 12 (WS): 1 sc dec over the next 2 sts, 1 sc in the next 8 sts, 1 sc dec over the next 2 sts, tch + turn (10 sc).

Round 13 (RS): 1 sc dec over the next 2 sts, 1 sc in the next st, ch 2 + skip the next 4 sts, 1 sc in the next st, 1 sc dec over the next 2 sts, tch + turn (4 sc, 1 ch2-sp).

Round 14 (WS): 1 sc dec over the next 2 sts, 2 sc around the next ch2sp, 1 sc dec over the next 2 sts, tch + turn (4 sc).

Round 15 (RS): 1 sl st in each st across the entire opening, fo (approximately 22 sl sts).

Sew attach your bottom with color D to the center of the pouch body; directly under the buttonhole, on rnd 10.
